
## Finger Spelling

if you are left-handed

- 1. Break the word apart by its phonemes (sounds), tapping the pad of each finger on the right-hand on a table (or in the air in front of a class) as each phoneme (sound) is segmented.
- 2. Then put the associated symbol for each sound on the same finger that had the sound. If one finger was represented for the sound, then only one finger is represented for the letter(s) by tapping the pad of the finger as above.




Use the <u>opposite hand</u> that <u>you write with</u>, so the pencil stays in the writing hand while the other hand can do the work (move each finger as you segment the sound).

if you are right-handed
